STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

RESOLVE, Authorizing a Tax and Cutting Practice Committee.

Resolved: Tax and cutting practice committee; appointment; appropriation. That a committee of 7 members be and hereby is created to study forest land tax and cutting practices to be composed of the state tax assessor, the state forest commissioner, I member of the senate appointed by the president of the senate, I member of the house of representatives appointed by the speaker of the house and 3 members appointed by the governor, I of whom shall be selected from a list of 5 names submitted by the master of the state grange; I of whom shall be selected from a list of 5 names submitted by the executive secretary of the Maine municipal association and I of whom shall be a representative timberland owner; and be it further

Resolved: That they shall report to the 96th legislature, suggesting such measures to correct present forest land tax and cutting problems as they deem advisable; and be it further

Resolved: That the sum of \$1,000 shall be appropriated from the general fund for travel expenses of committee members and to hire technical assistance. No salary shall be paid members of the committee.
