STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Driving of Deer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 83, amended. Section 83 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 83. Driving deer prohibited. It shall be unlawful to drive deer by use of horns, whistles or other noise making devices. Whoever in conjunction with 4 other persons shall go through the woods shouting or making other noises with the human voice or with any other sound-making device shall be construed to be driving deer. It shall also be unlawful for any person to hunt deer after he has killed one during the open season of that calendar year.'
