AN ACT Relating to Aid to Dependent Children.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 230, amended. Section 230 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 230. Amount of aid. The department shall send a written notice by mail to the chairman of the overseers of the poor or to the department of public welfare of the municipality of residence immediately upon receipt of an application. The notice shall contain the name and address of the applicant and the number of children for whom the grant is requested. The amount of aid which shall be granted for any dependent child shall be determined with due regard to the resources and necessary expenditures of the family and the conditions existing in each case on a budgetary basis in accordance with the rules and regulations of the department and shall be sufficient, when added to all other income and support available to the child, to provide such child with a reasonable subsistence compatible with decency and health.'
