STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

RESOLVE, Appropriating Moneys to Reactivate Mile Light at Cove Point Gore.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Cove Point Gore, near Greenville, Piscataquis county, is used as a base for boats and sea planes of the departments of forestry and inland fisheries and game; and

Whereas, navigation to Greenville passes Cove Point Gore; and

Whereas, to protect such navigation it is essential that Mile Light be reactivated to protect both life and property; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Mile Light reactivated; appropriation. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general fund the sum of \$1,200 to reactivate Mile Light at Cove Point Gore, near Greenville, Piscataquis county; and be it further

Resolved: That the appropriation shall be expended under the direction and supervision of the public utilities commission.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The sum of \$1,200 will be expended as follows:

1,000 feet of submarine cable

Lights and fixtures

Labor for laying cable, installation of poles and cross arms

\$850.00

150.00

The reactivation of Mile Light is essential for navigation coming into Greenville port. The departments of forestry and inland fisheries and game have bases for boats and seaplanes in this vicinity and the light is badly needed.
