STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

RESOLVE, in Favor of Jackman Plantation.

Jackman plantation; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$144 to be paid to Jackman plantation to reimburse said plantation for the 1948 poll taxes in Rockwood, an unorganized territory, the electors of which were provided voting privileges by said plantation; said sum to be paid from the general fund of the state.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Under the provisions of section 101-A of chapter 14 of the revised statutes, electors of the unorganized territory of Rockwood registered in Jackman plantation as voters and, under the provisions of this section, the poll taxes assessed and collected by the state tax assessor in 1948 from the electors of Rockwood are to be paid to Jackman plantation, provided that by June 1st of the following year the officials of Jackman certify as to the registration and voting. Such certification was rendered to the state tax assessor too late for a proper reimbursement.
