STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Arthur H. Molasky of Gorham.

Arthur H. Molasky; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$76.95 from the general fund of the state to be paid to Arthur H. Molasky, of Gorham, as a full and final settlement for his claim against the state for damage to his car by an escapee from the State Reformatory for Men.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

On June 27, 1950 inmate John Stevens escaped from his work assignment at the State Reformatory for Men. On 6/28/50 at 8:30 A. M. the state police reported the larceny of a 1939 Packard, 4 door sedan, Maine plate No. 107-413 had been stolen sometime during the night at White Rock, Gorham, Maine. At 10:00 A. M. June 28, 1950 the escapee was apprehended in this car at Hiram, Maine by state police. The car proved to be the property of Arthur H. Molasky of Gorham. The car had been driven at high speeds and showed considerable damage. The car was taken to Packard Portland Co. on June 29, 1950 for necessary repairs. The damage amounted to \$76.95. Insofar as Mr. Molasky is concerned his is a just claim since damage to his car was committed by an escapee from the State Reformatory for Men.
