STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to the Liquor Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 57, § 6, sub-§ IV-A, additional. Section 6 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding thereto a new subsection, to be numbered IV-A, to read as follows:

'IV-A. The commission shall not make any rule or regulation or adopt any practice which shall discriminate against any citizen of the state of Maine, nor grant any privilege or concession to any non-resident of this state which is not as freely offered to its citizens.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 57, § 7-A, additional. Chapter 57 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 7-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 7-A. Subpoena of evidence from companies selling liquor. Every contract of purchase of liquor or wine shall carry an agreement thereon, granting permission by the vendor to make available to any legally authorized investigating body, their books and records which pertain to transactions with the commission or any citizen of this state and the privilege of subpoenaing said records for use in this state.'
