STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Timothy J. Murphy, of Hallowell.

Timothy J. Murphy; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$6,500 to be paid to Timothy J. Murphy, of Hallowell, to compensate him in full for all claims against the state for damages and injuries sustained by him in the performance of his duties as an employee with the Maine state liquor commission; said sum to be paid from the general fund.

Committee Amendment "A" to S. P. 298, "Resolve in Favor of Timothy J. Murphy, of Hallowell."

Amend said Resolve by striking out the figures "\$6,500" in the 2nd line thereof, and inserting in place thereof the figures '\$4,000.'

STATEMENT OF FACTS

While Mr. Murphy was pursuing his duties as an employee of the Maine state liquor commission, he sustained injuries and damages in the amount of \$6,500 for which the state should compensate him.
