STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Guides for Non-Resident Hunters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 33, § 64-A, additional. Chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section, to be numbered 64-A, to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 64-A. Guides for non-resident hunters. No non-resident shall hunt any wild animal without a licensed guide. No guide shall be employed by more than 2 non-residents while so hunting at the same time. Whoever violates any provision of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$100, nor more than \$300, and costs, which fine and costs shall not be suspended.'
- Sec. 2. R. S., c. 33, § 72, amended. Section 72 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by repealing the last sentence of the 1st paragraph thereof.
