**RESOLVE, in Favor of a Retirement Allowance for Edith V. Jack of
Hollis Center.**

Edith V. Jack; retirement allowance. Resolved: That a retirement allowance of \$125 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Edith V. Jack of Hollis Center, to be paid monthly from the funds of the Maine state retirement system. Such retirement allowance shall be retroactive to August 20, 1951 and shall continue during her life. Such retirement allowance shall not be payable until the said Edith V. Jack has paid to the Maine retirement system the sum of \$1,884.14.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mr. George E. Jack, the late husband of Edith V. Jack, served the state of Maine in the field of education for 43 years and 5 months. He passed away June 10, 1951.

The 95th legislature by chapter 367 of the public laws of 1951 guaranteed a retirement option to deceased members of the retirement system who had already attained eligibility toward retirement. This law did not become effective until August 20, 1951. Had Mr. Jack lived until that date his beneficiary, who is his widow, would have received \$125 per month during her life. She only received \$1,884.14 as a lump sum settlement.

The purpose of the resolve is to remedy the explained inequity.
