**RESOLVE, Relating to Construction of a Road and Terminal in City of
Rockland.**

Emergency preamble. Whereas, under the provisions of chapter 176 of the resolves of 1951, certain state moneys were appropriated for a road and terminal in the city of Rockland and such appropriation was to be available until June 30, 1953; and

Whereas, Federal funds have been appropriated for a survey of the harbor at Rockland to commence this spring; and

Whereas, it is deemed vital by the legislature that the survey should be completed before any state moneys are expended; and

Whereas, it is vitally necessary to extend the time during which the state moneys are available beyond June 30, 1953; and

Whereas, acts and resolves of the legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Resolves, 1951, c. 176, amended. Resolved: That the last paragraph of chapter 176 of the resolves of 1951 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Resolved: That such appropriation be available until June 30, ~~1953~~ 1955.'

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.
