## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Hunting with Bow and Arrow in Penobscot County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, §§ 96-A, 96-B, amended. Sections 96-A and 96-B of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, are hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 96-A. Open season. There shall be an annual open season on deer in the counties of Franklin, Penobscot and Somerset from October 1st to October 15th, inclusive, for the purpose of hunting deer with bow and arrow only.'

'Sec. 96-B. License; tags. An archery license shall be issued by the commissioner to take deer under the provisions of sections 96-A to 96-E, inclusive, the fee for which shall be \$4.25 for hunting deer by residents of this state and \$10.25 for hunting deer by non-residents; except that in the county of Penobscot the archery license for non-residents shall also permit the hunting of such wild birds and animals which can be legally hunted from October 1st to October 15, inclusive. Archery deer tags shall be issued for use in the same manner as regular deer tags. If a person does take a deer with bow and arrow during the special season provided in section 96-A, he is precluded from further hunting for deer during that year. If a person does not take a deer with a bow and arrow during the special season provided in section 96-A, he is not precluded from obtaining a hunting license for the regular open season.'
