STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

RESOLVE Regulating Fishing in the Sheepscot River.

Fishing in Sheepscot river, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue the following rule and regulation:

'Fishing in the Sheepscot river, regulated. It shall be unlawful to use any type of net or seine in the Sheepscot river and its tributaries between the Wiscasset-North Edgecomb bridge and the so-called Headtide dam at Alna.

The fishing of lamprey eels within these waters shall be under the direction of the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries who may issue permits to take lamprey eels at places and by means designated by him.

Whoever violates any of the provisions of this rule and regulation shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$100, and costs, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.'
