STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Driving of Deer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 83, amended. Section 83 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 83. Horning or driving deer prohibited. It shall be unlawful to drive deer by use of horns, whistles or other noise-making devices. It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt deer after he has killed one during the open season of that calendar year. It shall be unlawful for four or more persons to participate in a joint hunt for deer, wherein an effort is made to drive the deer from any area.'
