RESOLVE, Opening Crane Pond to Ice Fishing.

Crane pond opened to ice fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to open Crane pond, commonly known as the Narrows in the town of Lincoln and on the opposite side of road $\frac{1}{2}$ township, lying easterly of a road leading from Lincoln to Burlington, the so-called Upper Cold Stream pond or commonly known as the Little Lake, to ice fishing.
