#### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

### AN ACT Relating to Bluehill-George Stevens Academy.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1891, c. 134, § 2, repealed and replaced. Section 2 of chapter 134 of the private and special laws of 1891, as amended by chapter 22 of the private and special laws of 1943, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:
- 'Sec. 2. Powers and privileges. Said corporation is hereby vested with all the rights, privileges and immunities incident to similar corporations, may have and use a common seal, prosecute and defend suits at law, make and establish such by-laws, not repugnant to the laws of this state, as may be necessary for the management of its affairs, may take and hold real and personal estate that it may now possess or which it may hereafter acquire by gift, devise, purchase or otherwise, to any amount.'
- Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1891, c. 134, § 6, additional. Chapter 134 of the private and special laws of 1891, as amended by chapter 22 of the private and special laws of 1891, as amended by chapter 22 of the private and special special laws of 1943, is hereby further amended by adding thereto a new section, to be numbered 6, to read as follows:
  - 'Sec. 6. Board of trustees. Full control and management of the affairs

and business of the corporation shall be vested in and exercised by a board of not less than 9 nor more than 20 trustees, the majority of the board of trustees to be legal residents of the town of Bluehill, Maine.'
