STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

RESOLVE in Favor of Indians at Pleasant Point Reservation for Building and Repair of Homes.

Indians at Pleasant Point Reservation; appropriation for. Resolved:

That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general fund of the state the sum of \$2,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1954, to be expended for the purpose of repairing existing homes and building new homes for the Indians of Pleasant Point Reservation; these funds to be expended on authorization of the department of health and welfare.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The American Friends Service Committee had a work project, employing about 18 adults, at Pleasant Point Reservation during the summer of 1952. Considerable work was done on the outside of Indians homes at that time. Some work needs to be done on the interior of the homes and also to complete the work on the exterior of a few homes that were not completed during the project last summer. Indians living on the reservation will be required to work on their own homes whenever there is an able-bodied Indian in the family group.
