STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to the Law of Manufacture and Sale of Bedding and Upholstered Furniture.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 151-B, amended. Section 151-B of chapter 22 of the revised statutes, as enacted by chapter 330 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 151-B. Proceeds payable into the general fund. All fees and other moneys collected in the administration of sections 147 to 151-C, inclusive, shall be credited to the general fund of the state. Provided, however, that there shall always be available for the administration of the provisions of section 147 to 151-C, inclusive, state moneys in an amount not less than the revenue derived from the fees collected under the provisions of sections 147 to 151-C, inclusive, except that any unexpended balances shall remain in the general fund. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund the sum of \$8000 for each year of the next biennium for administration of this law.'
