STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Penalty for Night Hunting.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 67, amended. The last paragraph of section 67 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No person shall have in his possession at any time any wild animal, or part thereof, taken in violation of the provisions of this section except as provided in section 97. Any person convicted of a violation under the provisions of this section shall be punished for the 1st offense by a fine of not less than \$200 \$400 and costs, nor more than \$400 \$600 and costs, which fine and costs shall not be suspended, and an additional penalty of not more than 30 days in jail, at the discretion of the court; and for a 2nd or subsequent offense, by a fine of not less than \$400 \$600 and costs, nor more than \$800 \$1,000 and costs, and 30 days in jail, which fine, costs and jail sentence shall not be suspended, and an additional penalty of not more than 60 days in jail, at the discretion of the court.'
