RESOLVE, in Favor of E. Stanley Kitchin of Rumford.

E. Stanley Kitchin; credit for teaching service. Resolved: That E. Stanley Kitchin, of Rumford, be given credit for 10 years of teaching rendered in Hebron academy, to be applied toward meeting requirements for a retirement benefit under the provisions of chapter 60.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

E. Stanley Kitchin was educated in the elementary schools of Palermo, graduated from Cony High School, Augusta, and was graduated from Colby College in the class of 1923. In addition he has, during several summer sessions, at the University of Maine, pursued professional courses. He has had approximately 29 years of education experience in Maine; 19 years in the public schools of Strong, Kingfield, East Millinocket, Millinocket, and Rumford; 10 years in Hebron Academy. Currently, he is principal of Stephens High School in Rumford.

To meet the provisions of the state employees' retirement law, Mr. Kitchin asks that 10 years of academy service be declared creditable for retirement purposes in order that he may realize maximum benefit of the law as soon as he becomes eligible for retirement privileges.
