AN ACT Relating to Definition of Elevator Under Board of Elevator Rules.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 25, § 99-B, amended. The second paragraph of section 99-B of chapter 25 of the revised statutes, as enacted by chapter 374 of the public laws of 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Elevator” shall mean a hoisting and lowering mechanism equipped with a car or platform which moves in guides in a substantially vertical direction. The term “elevator” shall not include a dumb-waiter, endless belt, conveyor, chain or bucket hoist or other **temporary** devices used for the primary purpose of elevating or lowering building ~~or other~~ materials, nor shall it include tiering, piling, feeding or other machines or devices giving service within only one story.’
