STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT to Appropriate Monies for Capital Improvements and Construction of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1954, and June 30, 1955.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves passed by the legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the number of patients at certain state institutions and student enrollment at certain normal schools has so increased that these institutions cannot continue to operate adequately unless more space is immediately provided; and

Whereas, the situation described herein has reached such proportions that it amounts to an emergency, the correction of which is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriations for necessary expenditures of state government. In order to provide for the necessary expenditures of state government for the next two fiscal years—from July I, 1953, to June 30, 1954, and from July I, 1954, to June 30, 1955—the following sums or as much thereof as shall be found necessary, as designated in the following tabulations, are hereby appropriated out of any monies in the general fund unappropriated surplus not otherwise appropriated. Upon receipt of allotments duly approved by the governor and council based upon work programs submitted to the commissioner of finance and state budget officer, the state controller shall authorize expenditures of these appropriations and revenues accruing thereto, on the basis of such allotments and not otherwise.

Any balances at June 30, 1954 shall not lapse but shall be carried forward into the following year to be expended for the same purposes. Any unencumbered balances at June 30, 1955 shall lapse unless sufficient evidence in the form of encumbrances is filed with the state controller prior to June 30, 1955, showing that the project is in process, in which case all monies appropriated to the project shall be carried to the following years to be expended for the same purpose until such project is completed, unless otherwise directed by the legislature.
