IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Hunting by Minors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 63, sub-§ VI, repealed and replaced. Subsection VI of section 63 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

‘VI. No person being less than 16 years of age shall be permitted to hunt within the state of Maine.

Any person, between the ages of 16 and 18 years, may hunt if accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. Such parent or guardian shall first obtain a license to hunt and shall cause to be inscribed on said license the name of said minor, and said minor shall at all times, while hunting, be in the immediate presence of such parent or guardian. In such case there shall be but one firearm in use between such parent or guardian and said minor.

In such cases the limit of fowl or game as prescribed shall apply to both as though only one of them had obtained such limit.

All fees for such licenses shall be fixed by the commissioner.’
