STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to the Taking of Soft Shell Clams, Quahogs and Mussels in Jonesport.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 34, § 62-B, additional. Chapter 34 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 62-B, to read as follows:

'Sec. 62-B. Taking of soft shell clams, quahogs and mussels in Jonesport; penalty. It shall be unlawful for any person, not a legal resident of the town of Jonesport, in the county of Washington, to dig or to take soft shell clams, quahogs or mussels, for any purpose, in the coastal waters and flats within the limits of the said town of Jonesport.

Whoever violates the provisions of this section shall, for each offense, be punished by a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
