STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Taking of Smelts from Songo River, Cumberland County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Taking of smelts from Songo river, regulated; penalty. It shall be unlawful for any person not a resident in the towns of Naples and Casco, Cumberland county, to take smelts from Songo river, beginning at the mouth of Sebago lake to the locks, so called, and from the locks up Crooked river to the second cement bridge.

Any such resident may take smelts not exceeding 3 quarts in any 1 day.

Any person taking smelts contrary to the provisions of this act shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
