### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

#### AN ACT Relating to Turning Movements and Required Signals for Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 19, § 107-A, amended.** The 1st paragraph of section 107-A of chapter 19 of the revised statutes, as enacted by chapter 301 of the public laws of 1951, as hereby amended to read as follows:

'No person shall turn a vehicle at an intersection unless the vehicle is in proper position upon the roadway as required in section 107, or turn a vehicle to enter a private road or driveway or otherwise turn a vehicle from a direct course, or move right or left upon a roadway unless and until such movement can be made with reasonable safety. No person shall so turn any vehicle designed for the purpose of transportation of persons, other than buses without giving an appropriate signal in the manner provided in this section and sections 107-B and 107-C in the event any other traffic may be affected by such movement.'
