**AN ACT Relating to Manufacturers and Bottlers of Non-Alcoholic
Beverages.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 27, § 216, repealed and replaced. Section 216 of chapter 27 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed and the following section enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 216. **Manufacturers and bottlers of non-alcoholic beverages.** No person, firm or corporation shall manufacture or bottle for sale at wholesale within this state any drink product or non-alcoholic beverage without first having filed with the commissioner, an application for license accompanied with a fee of \$15. Upon receipt of such application for a license containing information required by said commissioner, and upon being satisfied that the applicant has complied with sections 216 to 224, inclusive, said commissioner shall issue to the applicant a license. Said license shall run for the current year until the 30th day of June following date of application, on which date it shall terminate, unless sooner revoked as herein provided and it shall be renewed annually thereafter. The provisions of this section shall not apply to out-of-state manufacturers, bottlers or distributors of non-alcoholic cereal beverages, non-alcoholic fruit juices nor to any person within this state who manufactures sweet cider.'
