# STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

#### RESOLVE, in Favor of Mrs. Carol Hapworth of Winslow.

**Carol Hapworth; compensated. Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$300 to be paid to Mrs. Carol Hapworth, of Winslow, as a full and final settlement for her claim against the state for loss of one cow which died as a result of a Bang's disease and T. B. test; said sum to be paid from the funds of the department of agriculture.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

In April 1951, an inspector for the department of agriculture tested Mrs. Hapworth's cattle for T. B. and Bang's disease. During the process, part of the needle broke and remained in the cow. Immediately after the test, the cow became sick and had to be killed. Mrs. Hapworth received only \$12 for her hide, and at that time part of the needle which had broken off during the test was found.
