STATE OF MAINE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 96th LEGISLATURE

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 324, L. D. 392, Bill "An Act relating to Minimum Salaries for Teachers."

Amend said Bill by striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

"Sec. 1. R. S., c. 37, §201, amended. The 6th paragraph of section 201 of chapter 37 of the revised statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 1 of chapter 386 of the public laws of 1951, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Each city, town, plantation and community school district shall employ only certified teachers and shall pay such teachers the minimum salaries as follows:

Five years of teaching experience shall be considered equal to 1

year of advance study, Notwithstanding the provisions of this

paragraph, no town shall be required to increase the salary of any
teacher more than \$100 in any one school year.

Sec. 2. Effective date. The provisions of this act shall become effective July 1, 1954."
