STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the City of Auburn.

City of Auburn; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$1,768.82 from the general fund of the state to be paid to the city of Auburn to reimburse it for pauper supplies furnished to the family of Otis Colson from April 1949 to January 1952, said Otis Colson family being at the time of said expenditures were made, state paupers.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The city of Auburn accepted the responsibility of the Colson family when a pauper notice was received from the town of Searsport on the 31st day of December, 1948. This notice contained erroneous information which later was proven not to be the facts of the case. The state department of health and welfare accepted the responsibility of the Colson family on May 29, 1952. The acceptance was based upon the true facts of the case that was obtained and submitted by the city of Auburn welfare department. Since that date the state department of health and welfare has assumed the liability of the family whenever it was found to be necessary.
