STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Guards on Rear of Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, § 32-A, additional. Chapter 19 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 32-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 32-A. Rear guards. Every motor vehicle or trailer shall be constructed or equipped so that the rear end of such vehicle shall offer reasonable protection to the occupants of a following vehicle that may be in collision with the rear end of such vehicle or trailer. Bumpers, guards or body construction shall extend no less than 3 feet in height measured vertically from a plane and level surface of ground or pavement and shall be located no more than 2 feet forward of the extreme rear of the vehicle or trailer.'
