STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Additional Appeal from Liquor Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 60-A, amended. The 1st sentence of the 2nd paragraph of section 60-A of chapter 57 of the revised statutes, as enacted by section 2 of chapter 419 of the public laws of 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'If any person is aggrieved by the decision or rule and regulation of the commission in revoking or suspending any license issued by the commission or by refusal of the commission to issue any license or permit applied for, or by the denial of the commission of a request for permission filed by a licensee for changes or alterations in the licensed premises, or for clarification of the commission's rules and regulations, he may within 10 days thereafter appeal to any justice of the superior court, by presenting to him a petition therefor, in term time or vacation.'
