STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Definition of "Tavern" in Liquor Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 1, amended. The 4th paragraph from the end of section 1 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes, which was enacted by section 1 of chapter 322 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Tavern" shall mean a reputable place for men only operated by responsible persons where no food is sold except confectionery and no business is carried on except the sale of malt liquor at a bar and except the sale of tobacco products. There shall be no table, chairs or other seating accommodations and all persons served shall remain standing at the bar. Nothing in this paragraph shall prohibit the hiring, employing or using women on the licensed premises.'
