STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Line Budget for State Appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 14, § 7, sub-§ III-A, additional. Section 7 of chapter 14 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection, to be numbered III-A, to read as follows:
 - 'III-A. To approve all new positions of employment in the state government and to compile a list of all new positions created during any fiscal year as a public record;'
- Sec. 2. R. S., c. 14, § 13, amended. The first 2 sentences of section 13 of chapter 14 of the revised statutes are hereby repealed and the following sentence enacted in place thereof:
- 'The appropriation bill provided for in section 9 shall be drawn so as to authorize the appropriation to be made to each department or agency of the state government for each fiscal year of the biennium. Such appropriation shall provide specific amounts for personal services, contractual services, commodities, grants, subsidies and pensions, and capital expenditures.'
- Sec. 3. R. S., c. 14, § 14, amended. The 1st sentence of section 14 of chapter 14 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Not later than June 1st of each year, the governor shall require the head of each department and agency of the state government to submit to the department of finance a work program for the ensuing fiscal year, such program shall include all appropriations made available to said department or agency for its operation and maintenance and for the acquisition of property, and it shall show the requested allotments of said appropriations by quarters for the entire fiscal year, classified to show expenditures requested for specific amounts for personal services, contractual services, commodities, grants, subsidies and pensions, and capital expenditures.'
