HOUSE AMENDMENT "B" to H. P. 685, L. D. 720, Bill "An Act Transferring Maine School for the Deaf to Department of Education."

Amend said Bill by striking out the underlined words and punctuation "<u>at Portland</u>," in the 2nd line of that part designated "Sec. 162-B".

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of that part designated "Sec. 162-D" and inserting in place thereof the following:

"<u>Sec. 162-D.</u> Admittance of children to school. With the consent of the child's parent or guardian, the department may admit to said school any deaf and dumb child residing in this state, and not less than 2 years of age, said child to be permitted to remain in the school until the completion of the school's course. The sums necessary for the support and instruction of such children while attending said school shall be paid by the state.¹"
