STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Operation of School Buses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, § 105-A, amended. Section 105-A of chapter 19 of the revised statutes, as enacted by chapter 385 of the public laws of 1949, and as repealed and replaced, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 105-A. Overtaking and passing school buses. The driver of a vehicle on a way upon meeting or overtaking from either direction any school bus which has stopped on the way for the purpose of receiving or discharging any school children shall stop the vehicle before reaching such school bus and shall not proceed until such school bus resumes motion, or until signaled by the school bus driver to proceed. Each motor vehicle, carrying the designation "School Bus," shall conceal or remove such designation when such motor vehicle is parked on any way or used for any purpose other than transportation of pupils.'
