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**AN ACT Relating to Students in Schools of Hairdressing and Beauty Culture.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 22, § 214, amended.** Section 214 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof the following paragraphs:

‘It shall be lawful, however, for students in said schools aforesaid to become affiliated with hairdressing or beauty culture shops and this may be done during the 1,500 hour training period set forth herein; provided, however, that said affiliation shall not exceed 100 hours. The provisions of this paragraph are not compulsory.

The supervision of said students would be under the board but shops would be allowed to pay for traveling expenses of the students.

Upon the receipt of a certificate from the shop owner credit for the work done is to be given by the school towards the 1,500 hours of study.’
