STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Compulsory Plugging of Lobsters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 34, § 117-A, additional. Chapter 34 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 117-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 117-A. Compulsory plugging of lobsters. Whoever sells or exposes for sale any lobsters except those which are double plugged shall be punished by a fine of \$5 for each such lobster involved.

Such plugs shall be distributed by the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries at nominal cost.'
