## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to the Issuance of Operators' Licenses From Date of Birth with Notification.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, § 48, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 48 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'All licenses to operate a motor vehicle which expire on December 31, 1954 shall continue in full force, effect and validity, unless suspended or revoked, until the anniversary of the date of birth of the license holder next following the date of December 31, 1954. All licenses to operate motor vehicles issued after December 31, 1954 shall expire annually at midnight on the anniversary of the license holder's date of birth. A person born on February 29 shall, for the purposes of this section, be considered as born on March 1. The secretary of state shall, at least 30 days prior to the birth anniversary of each license holder, mail first class to such license holder an application for renewal of license. Whenever any person, after applying for or receiving an operator's license, shall move from the address named in such application or in the license issued to him; or when the name of a license holder is changed by marriage or otherwise, such person shall with-

in 10 days thereafter notify the secretary of state, in writing, of his old and new addresses or of such former and new names and of the number of any license then held by him.'
