STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Use of Lights to Illuminate Wild Bilds or Animals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 67-A, additional. Chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 67-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 67-A. Illuminating wild birds or animals. The deliberate use of a light during the months of September, October and November for the purpose of illuminating or attempting to show up wild birds or animals shall be illegal.'
