STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Bounty on Bears.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 103, amended. The 1st paragraph of section 103 of chapter 33, of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'For a period of 2 years, from August 13, 1954 1953, except in Franklin county, a bounty of \$15 shall be paid for each and every bear killed in organized townships and plantations and unorganized townships adjoining organized townships and plantations, except that bounties shall be paid under this section on all bear killed in the counties of Penobscot, Piscataquis and Aroostook to the person killing the same, by the treasurer of the organized township or plantation in which said bear was killed or the treasurer of any organized township or plantation adjoining the unorganized territory in which said bear was killed. These bounties shall be paid by such treasurers Where there is no organized township or plantation adjoining the unorganized territory in which the bear was killed the bounty shall be paid by the treasurer of the nearest organized township or plantation.'
