## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Salaries and Fees of Western Somerset Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1909, c. 331, § 8, amended. The 1st sentence of section 8 of chapter 331 of the private and special laws of 1909, as amended by chapter 130 of the private and special laws of 1949, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

As compensation for his services in that capacity the judge of said court shall receive an annual salary of \$2,700 \$3,000, payable in quarterly instalments from the treasury of the county of Somerset, on the 1st days of January, April, July and October, and in addition shall receive his necessary traveling expenses, including mileage allowance, hotel expenses, meals, etc., when holding court in another town than that in which he resides, and he shall receive an additional sum of \$1,000 \$1,500 per year for clerk hire and such additional amount as may be authorized by the county commissioners.'

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1909, c. 331, § 8, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 8 of chapter 331 of the private and special laws of 1909, as enacted by chapter 81 of the private and special laws of 1943, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'All bills for such expenses shall be approved by the clerk of courts and county attorney for Somerset county and paid by the treasurer of said county; and all fees received by him in said capacity, except while acting as a disclosure commissioner, shall be by him turned over to the county of Somerset.'
