STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relative to Partial Compensation in Vacation Periods Under Employment Security Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 24, § 14, sub-§ III, amended. Subsection III of section 14 of chapter 24 of the revised statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 1 of chapter 430 of the public laws of 1949, and as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'III. He is able to work and is available for work and in addition to having complied with the provisions of subsection H is himself making a reasonable effort to seek work at his usual or customary trade, occupation, profession or business or in such other trade, occupation, profession or business or in such other trade, occupation, profession or business as his prior training or experience shows him to be fitted or qualified; provided that an individual shall be ineligible to receive benefits for any week which is recognized as a vacation period for his grade, class or shift at the factory, mill, workshop or other premises where he is employed, and no distinction shall be made between those who receive pay during vacation periods and those who do not; except that an individual who is not entitled to pay during the vacation period may qualify for benefits or credit for his waiting period if he is available for work and complies with the other conditions of eligibility;'
