AN ACT Relating to Duties of the Liquor Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 6, sub-§ VII, amended. The 2nd sentence of subsection VII of section 6 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby repealed and the following sentences enacted in place thereof:

'In issuing or renewing licenses the commission shall give consideration to the character of any applicant, the location of the place of business, and the manner in which it has been operated. In the case of corporate applicants, the commission may refuse to issue licenses when they have reasonable grounds for believing, that any officer, director or other persons who directly or indirectly exercise or have the right to exercise, control or supervision over the management or operation of the corporation business, do not possess the qualifications required of unincorporated persons under the provisions of this section.'
