IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Defining "Retail Store" in Liquor Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding after the paragraph thereof defining "Restaurant" a new paragraph, to read as follows:

"Retail store" shall mean any bona fide store selling merchandise of any and every description to the ultimate consumer. Said merchandise need not consist of groceries and food staples, but may be of any general character. Said retail store must have an inventory of stock, exclusive of malt or vinous liquors, to a value of not less than \$500."
