STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Stock in Trade of Liquor Licensees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 22-D, amended. Section 22-D of chapter 57 of the revised statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 264 of the public laws of 1949, and as amended, is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph, to read as follows:

‘All retail store licensees must have and maintain an adequate stock of merchandise reasonably compatible with a stock of liquor in no case less than \$1,000 wholesale value. Licensees for sale of malt liquor to be consumed on the premises must have and maintain fixtures and furnishings of a value no less than \$1,000.’
