STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Expenses of Maintaining Burying Grounds in Unorganized Territory.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts of the legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment; and

Whereas, in order for the assessment provided by this legislature to become effective for the year 1953, it is vitally necessary that this act become effective immediately; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 54, § 5, amended. Section 5 of chapter 54 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following:

'All expenses and costs incurred while carrying out the provisions of this section shall annually be assessed, by the county commissioners, against the estates of the county containing such burying ground.'

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.
