STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

RESOLVE, to Repair State Aid Road in Greenwood.

State aid road in Greenwood; repair of. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general highway fund the sum of \$20,000 to repair state aid road No. 1, which begins at the Norway town line and extends in a northerly direction, leading through Greenwood village, so called, and extending by Twitchell and South ponds to route No. 26 at Locke Mills village; said appropriation to be expended under the direction and supervision of the state highway commission. Any unexpended balance shall not lapse, but shall be carried forward to be expended for the same purpose in any succeeding fiscal year.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This road is used for trucking farm produce to market; also located in lumbering and mining district. Many tourists visit Greenwood each year to collect minerals. The road is in such condition that it is impassable in the spring and almost so at other seasons of the year. There are 57 year-round residents and 31 summer residents located on this road.
