**RESOLVE, in Favor of Sadie M. D. Jewell of Orono.**

---

**Sadie M. D. Jewell; to be given credit. Resolved:** That Sadie M. D. Jewell of Orono be given credit for approximately 2 years of teaching service to qualify her to receive the minimum retirement benefit provided for by chapter 60, revised statutes as amended, for a teacher who has completed 25 years of creditable teaching service.

**STATEMENT OF FACTS**

Sadie M. D. Jewell of Orono has for some little time been endeavoring to validate with the state retirement system a sufficient number of years to qualify her to make application for a retirement benefit. From various authentic sources it has finally been determined that the total number of years of teaching service for which she can furnish validation amounts to approximately 23 years.

Her teaching service began for the first time in 1903 and due to the very great difficulty of securing proper certificates of service for some of those years, at that time, it is possible that she did have in fact more service than has been evidenced by the filing of certificates from various sources, and this resolve is presented for the purpose of definitely establishing her

credits for 25 years of teaching so that in her advanced age she may begin to enjoy the relatively small benefit provided for under the law for that period of time.

Mrs. Jewell was born on February 25, 1886 and has done some teaching service on a part-time or substitute basis up to and including the year 1951.
