STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Granting a Pension to Hubert E. Redding, of Oakland.

Teacher's pension granted to Hubert E. Redding. Resolved: That Hubert E. Redding, of Oakland, be given credit for an additional 3 years of teaching service in a private school so that he may be entitled to a retirement benefit under the provisions of chapter 60 of the revised statutes.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mr. Redding taught 3 years in Pine Tree Academy, Auburn, in a private school which operated from about 1921 to 1933, and closed because of financial difficulties during the depression years. This school was duly certified by the state department of education and served the youth of this state during that period of time. Its graduates have gone out into the state in lines of public work, including teaching. Mr. Redding has 19 years of public school work.
